

Climate litigation

Significant rise in cases

As of May, 2022: 2002 cases around the world (compared to approx. 800 in 2015)

Majority of cases in the US (1,426)

70% of cases against governments

But: litigation against corporates on the rise, in particular outside the US

Many sectors affected: Only 16 out of 38 cases filed against corporate defendants in 2021 were against fossil fuel companies; more than half in other sectors (food and agriculture, transport, plastics and finance)
